This current result is also markedly higher than the Provincial 3 year average in these two areas. It will be important for us to discuss and be mindful of what factors contributed to this.
- We are in the blue and green in all areas of the survey which we are grateful for.
- However, in several of these areas, we are slightly lower than our previous 3 year averages, except in the areas of PAT results and Parental Involvement where we are higher in both than our previous 3 year averages.
- In all areas, we are higher currently than the current provincial averages in all areas except slightly below provincial average in the area of Student Learning Engagement

VM Commentary and Analysis: School reflections/comments:

- Parent perceptions on student citizenship are down from the last 4 years
- Student perceptions are close to equaling the previous 4 year high
- Teacher perceptions on student citizenship remain very high
- Overall VM results in Citizenship are higher than both the MHPSD and Provincial averages

VM Commentary and Analysis: School reflections/comments:

- Overall results from stakeholders in this area of Welcoming, Caring, Safe Learning Environments is still very positive at 88.6%. This is very similar to previous 3 year average at VM. Overall results are higher than MHPSD and Provincial averages.
- While parent perceptions in this area are still positive, they are down a little from previous 3 year averages. Slightly below MHPSD and provincial averages.
- Student perception in this area remain very positive similar to past 3 years, significantly higher than current MHPSD and Provincial averages
- VM Teacher perceptions in this area remain very strong, higher than MHPSD and provincial current averages.

- Parent perceptions in this area are equal to last year at VM, but lower than the previous 3 years. Current VM results in this area are slightly lower than MHPSD and provincial parent perceptions.
- VM Teacher perceptions in the area of parental involvement are at a 5 year high, significantly higher than MHPSD and provincial teacher perceptions in this area.
